



Developed by the **Knox County Public Library** and the East Tennessee Historical Society, this traveling exhibition explores how children's literature serves as a window to Appalachia, commenting on and/or reflecting the region's culture. Large, two-sided graphic panels introduce visitors to Appalachian authors, past and present, and encourage them to re-examine their own definition of what it means "to be Appalachian."



Reading Appalachia offers the following programmatic opportunities: children's literacy, storytelling, Appalachian history/culture, among others.

The exhibition has been designed for display in both museums and libraries.



EXHIBITION COMPONENTS

Seventeen (16) two-sided panels, each 30" w x 80" h and supported by a life-size character cutout

Content divided into the following sections: Introduction (4), Early Voices (1), Storytelling (1), Fox Fire (1), Folklore (2), Nature Writing (1), Appalachian Voices (4), Books to Movies (1), Conclusion (1)

Three (3) videos: Interview with Ray Hicks; interview with George Ella Lyon; clips from movies based on Appalachian children's literature

Each panel contains text and/or activities developed to engage children

Museums and libraries are encouraged to augment the exhibition with items from their collections, such as copies of books and children's toys
